Who is eligible to attend events?

- Veterans who were medically retired from the WTB and are still in the area are welcome.
- Family events include children up to age 18 single and living at home.

Sign up is generally through the Chaplain's office however a signup sheet will also be available at WFSC. Bear in mind there is limited space for all events so signing up doesn't guarantee you a spot.
