Soldier Songs and Voices

Wounded Warriors at Nebo partnered with the Texas Heritage Music Foundation and Soldiers Songs and Voices to host a workshop for combat veterans. September 15-18.

This was the first time these three organizations had worked together. It was also a new type of event for the WWAN ministry although the SSV is experienced and dedicated to helping combat veterans through music. The ministry is made up of professional musicians who volunteer their time and talent.

Seven combat veterans and 4 professional musicians came together for two days of collaboration and mentoring in the art of poetry and lyric writing. They spent the days talking, exchanging ideas, collaborating and fine-tuning



their compositions which were based on their military experiences.

This was a diverse group of warriors whose age and experience included serving in Vietnam, Desert Storm, Iraq and Afghanistan.
